## Psalm 106:1-6, 19-23<sup>ii</sup>

<sup>1</sup>Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, *
for his mercy endures forever.

About Psalm 106:1-6, 19-23

Israel is invited to praise God who always tempers divine judgment with mercy. The people can always depend on God's fidelity despite their sins. Thus confident of God's mercy, the psalmist urges the people's repentance by recalling eight instances of sin, judgment and forgiveness. These verses recall the sin of worshipping the golden calf at Horeb.
