## Psalm 107:1-3, 23-32<sup>vi</sup>

<sup>1</sup>Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, \*and his mercy endures forever. <sup>2</sup>Let all those whom the LORD has redeemed proclaim \* that he redeemed them from the hand of the foe. <sup>3</sup>He gathered them out of the lands; \* from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south. <sup>23</sup>Some went down to the sea in ships \* and plied their trade in deep waters; <sup>24</sup>They beheld the works of the LORD \* and his wonders in the deep. <sup>25</sup>Then he spoke, and a stormy wind arose, \* which tossed high the waves of the sea.  $^{26}$ They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths; \* their hearts melted because of their peril. <sup>27</sup>They reeled and staggered like drunkards \* and were at their wits' end. <sup>28</sup>Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble,\* and he delivered them from their distress. <sup>29</sup>He stilled the storm to a whisper \* and quieted the waves of the sea.  $^{30}$ Then were they glad because of the calm, \* and he brought them to the harbor they were bound for. <sup>31</sup>Let them give thanks to the LORD for his mercy \*
