^{1.} There is no denial of the realities of life in light of human limitation, but neither is there a loss of faith in spite of great tragedy.

^{2.} There is an awareness that in all God does, the focus is to restore the balance which save the world. This theme is stated in verse 3. This idea of balanced relationship translates the traditional word "righteousness" which, again, means right-relatedness: things in right relationship to one another.
